#### **PEACEBUILDING**

At WPDI, Peacebuilding action embodies our commitment to fostering resilience and concord through grassroots initiatives and community involvement.

We recognize that sustainable peace begins at the local level, where individuals and communities are directly engaged in addressing and resolving conflicts. Our peacebuilding approach focuses on empowering local actors, including leaders, students, and teachers, to become active participants in creating a culture of peace.

We approach peacebuilding by integrating conflict mediation, advocacy for peace values, and conflict resolution training into our programs on the ground. By working closely with community members, we help to bridge divides and build mutual understanding. Our goal is to transform conflict into opportunities for dialogue and cooperation, ensuring that communities are equipped to handle disputes and motivated to work together toward lasting peace.

### **LIVELIHOOD**

WPDI's Livelihood Initiative promotes economic development through local empowerment, spanning five countries across three continents.

In 2025, we continued to cement our role as a driver of sustainable development, demonstrating how vocational training and entrepreneurship can transform lives in some of the world's most vulnerable communities. This year builds on the achievements of the previous one, when WPDI supported the creation of 308 new local businesses in France, Mexico, Uganda, South Africa, and South Sudan, bringing our global total to 1,020 active enterprises.

Beyond the encouraging numbers, these enterprises represent opportunity, hope, and resilience, changing not only individual lives but entire communities.

### **HEALTH AND WELL-BEING**

Many of the communities we operate in have suffered years of conflict, instability and a total lack of supportive infrastructure. People in these communities have often experienced various forms of trauma, and are in need of support.

Very early on, providing mental health and well-being services has been part of our work, notably in refugee contexts, eventually realizing the extent of the need. This is why in 2023, WPDI created a new Health and Well-being pillar to include trauma healing as a core part of our action. In the framework of this pillar, we set up and develop trauma healing initiatives, mental health training programs and informative programs on health, notably sexual and reproductive health, in the marginalized communities where we operate in order to help vulnerable people heal and find peace. Our ambition is to provide community members tools that are adapted to their ages and conditions so they can regain their resilience capacity, achieve inner peace and, in turn, contribute to making peace happen among people and communities.

#### **PEACE THROUGH SPORTS**

Sports have a fundamental human appeal. They can connect people across cultures, religions, nationalities, languages, and other divides.

Recognizing the potential of sports as a vector for peacebuilding, WPDI created the Peace Through Sports program to empower young men and women to embrace and practice positive values in dynamic and inclusive environments. The program combines life skills training with the excitement of organized competitions, community events, and regular training sessions led by qualified coaches.

Beyond the joy of participation, these activities inspire young people to shine as leaders and agents of positive change in their communities. Together, we can use the universal language of sports to foster peace and unity.
