Peacebuilding

In countries where violence and instability have been the norm for many years, basic social institutions that most of us take for granted are often lacking.

Peacebuilding is WPDI's strategy to maintain conditions of peace in the daily lives of the underprivileged communities where we operate, through educational and vocational initiatives that help local people learn the skills and knowledge required to resolve conflict in a peaceful manner. These include Conflict Resolution Education programs in schools and at our Community Learning Centers, Community Dialogue sessions, Community Leaders training and advocacy campaigns. The skills taught in the framework of these programs are essential if communities are to create conditions for lasting, sustainable peace.

Livelihood

Our Livelihood pillar is focused on vocational training. The idea is to create a local process of economic development led by local people, with a particular focus on empowering youths and women.

In the framework of our Livelihood global strategy, we provide training programs in Business and Entrepreneurship, ICT and Arts & Crafts. The Business Bootcamp, (which) is the main program of this pillar, is a business incubation platform designed to promote local entrepreneurship and provide vocational trainings for marginalized communities geared towards financial independence. Supporting small businesses designed and run by young people, women and members of the local community as a whole is a key element of our work.

Health and Wellbeing

Many of the communities we operate in have suffered years of conflict, instability and a total lack of supportive infrastructure.

People in these communities have often experienced various forms of trauma, and are in need of support. This is why health and wellbeing has been elevated as an essential pillar of WPDI's mandate. In the framework of this pillar, we set up and develop trauma healing initiatives, mental health training programs, and informative programs onn health, notably sexual and reproductive health, in the marginalized communities where we operate in order to help vulnerable people heal and find peace.

I developed symptoms of mental illness in April 2020 at the peak of Covid 19 when I was 26 years old after being diagnosed with COVID-19. I was isolated, started having emotional problems for the first time and was hospitalized for one month. My darkest moment was when I was discharged from the hospital, I started having a lot of fear and feeling angry about life. Not getting along with family and friends was causing problems. But after the WPDI team visited me during their routine follow-up and home visits, I was

Peace Through Sports

Sports have a fundamental human appeal. They can connect people across cultures, religions, nationalities, languages, and other divides.

When people participate in sporting activities, they can learn values, attitudes and behaviors of tolerance, mutual respect, fair play and teamwork. Sports can, in a few words, be an important tool for instilling life skills and a culture of peace and reconciliation. In this light, WPDI designed the Peace Through Sports program as a vehicle for young men and women to learn and practice those values, all while having fun and shining. The program includes life skills training, the organization of competitions and events and regular training sessions for teams and individuals with qualified coaches.

The sports program has been an amazing place for making friends with people from other groups and tribes. The refugee settlement hosts people from different tribes that were hostile at home, and before WPDI arrived, there were many fights. But with the Peace Through Sports program, I started meeting with girls from other tribes and we became friends. I learned how to play soccer, I practiced hard and became captain of WPDI's female football team. Last year, I joined South Sudan's National Female Soccer Team. Since then, I have scored nearly 80 goals and have been able to travel internationally for matches. I have also been able to have an impact by confronting the belief that women and girls cannot play football and support their families."



Playing football has helped me a lot. The positive advice I get from our regular training sessions has pushed me to remain in school. I have made good friends who only talk about positive things like how to become an international football player. All in all, the games have reduced stress and made my community
